II. Report from the Graduate Admissions committee – Ken Lohmann

This year, there were a total of about 190 completed applications. The department admitted 42 and 12 have accepted (EEOB accepted 12 and 3 have accepted; MCDB accepted 27 and 9 have accepted; 4 students were accepted as interdisciplinary students and none accepted).

Of the graduate school fellowships, none were accepted this year. There was some discussion on how to make these fellowships a more effective recruiting tool, such as bundling 3 1-year fellowships into a single 3-year fellowship.

III. Website update – Jeff Sekelsky

The website committee has designed and launched a new website for the department. Sekelsky gave an overview of the new features and organization. There is a plan to develop an intra-departmental website for documents, announcements, and discussions within the department.

IV. Position request for next year – Steve Matson

The department will renew last years request for an ecologist and will ask for a second position in evolutionary biology. Both would be assistant professor positions.

The department is also nominating a senior evolutionary biologist for a Bowles Professorship. There is interest in finding a high-profile female scientist to fill a joint-position in Biology and Women's studies as a Bowles Professor. Any thought on suitable candidates should be forwarded to Matson.
